**Photosensitivity**

Low to moderate; slightly ambers with age and sunlight exposure. Steamed beech naturally darkens.

**Grain**

Diffuse-porous; straight, fine, and generally uniform, with occasional interlock.

**Janka Hardness**

1300 lbf average.

**Specific Gravity**

0.64 average at 12% MC.

**In-Use Stability**

Below average.

**Finish Notes**

Sands very well with a careful grit progression and takes stain and finish nicely.

## Beech

### Unfinished

Beech Character brings a refined, European-inspired look to wide plank flooring while embracing the natural movement that makes real hardwood feel alive. Heartwood is typically a light reddish-brown, while sapwood ranges from pale white to straw with subtle pink or brown undertones.

Its fine, straight grain and generally uniform texture create a smoother visual field than open-grained species, yet the character grade still introduces welcome contrast and organic shifts from board to board.

### Distinctive Attributes

Character grading welcomes natural heartwood and sapwood variation, mineral coloration, and sound knots. Open knots and open character up to 1/2 in. are fillable for a more organic, naturally varied look.
