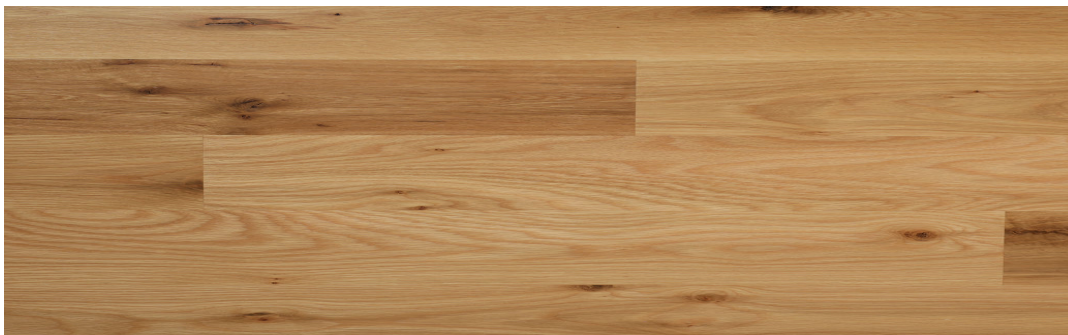

White Oak Character brings a more expressive take on classic American white oak, with broad natural variation and the grain definition that makes the species so enduring. Heartwood can range from light to medium brown through pale yellowish-brown and darker pale-brown tones, often with a subtle olive cast.

Its ring-porous structure and open, medium-to-coarse texture create a surface with depth and movement, making it a strong fit for interiors that want timeless oak character with a naturally varied visual profile.

Distinctive Attributes

This character-grade floor welcomes prominent variation in heartwood and sapwood, along with sound knots, open character, worm holes, checks, and streaking. Open knots and open character up to 1/2 in. are fillable, and heartwood/sapwood variation is intentionally unrestricted for an organic, naturally expressive look.
