Walnut

UNFINISHED

Walnut offers the unmistakable depth and contrast of a classic American hardwood. Heartwood ranges from light grayish brown to dark chocolate brown and even purplish black, while the nearly white to yellowish-gray sapwood remains clearly defined against the darker field.

Its open grain and naturally varied figure create a surface with elegance and visual movement. Straight grain is common, though curly, wavy, and irregular patterns may appear, with burls, crotches, and knots contributing to walnut's distinctive character.

Distinctive Attributes

This character-grade floor highlights the dramatic relationship between dark heartwood and lighter sapwood, along with sound knots and expressive natural figure. Open knots and open character up to 1/2 in. are fillable, and the grade may include worm holes, checks, streaks, pith, and limited sapwood for a richly varied appearance.
